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How to use Bottle Cap Color Activity Pages:

Bottle Cap Activity Pages are quickly becoming a staple during our preschool time each morning.

For many weeks, we saved bottle caps from our milk cartons, as I just *knew* there was some activity where we could use them! (You can also save the lid from soda or water bottles, as they're all the same size.)

I decided to create a set of 26 letters for my preschoolers to arrange in alphabetical order and "write" their names with them. While using them, I brainstormed a ton of other uses for them, one of those being these color sheets.

To use the Bottle Cap Color Activity Pages, follow these steps:

- 1. After downloading this printable set, print pages 3-6 on cardstock. Laminate for longer durability.
- 2. Cut out each color set along the dark black lines. Each rectangle section should now have two portions: the color and color name in the top section and the circles in the bottom section.
- 3. If you don't have bottle caps, print and laminate page 6. You'll need to print the page twice to have enough letters, since some words have more than 1 of the same letter. Then cut around each circle to create your own bottle caps.
- 4. Have your child identify the color and then spell it in the circles with the bottle caps.
