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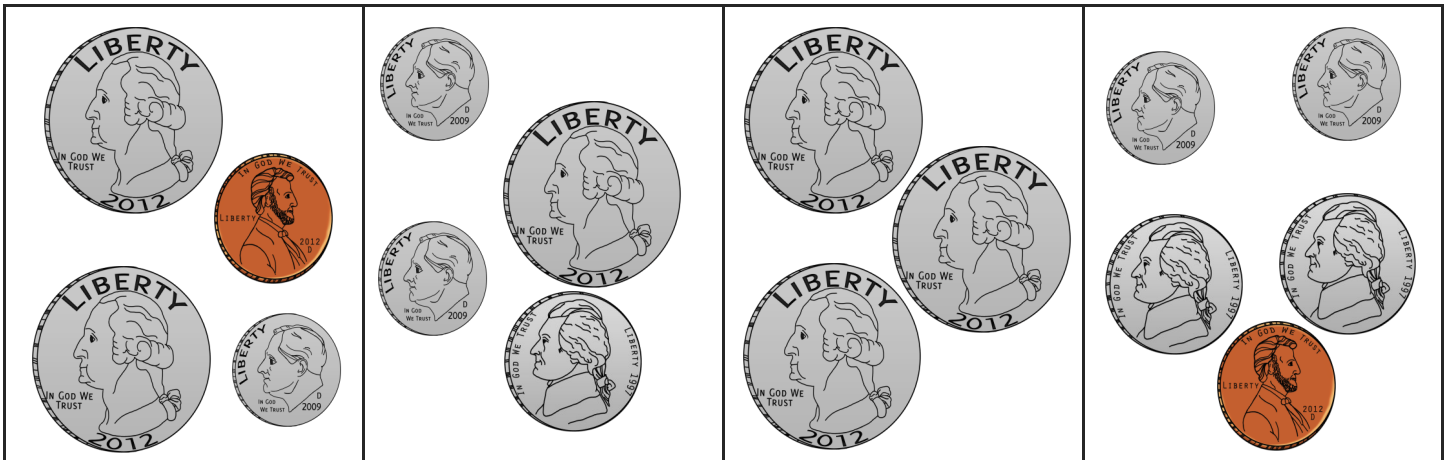
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Money Riddles

Use the clues to solve each money riddle below. Circle the correct group of coins for each riddle

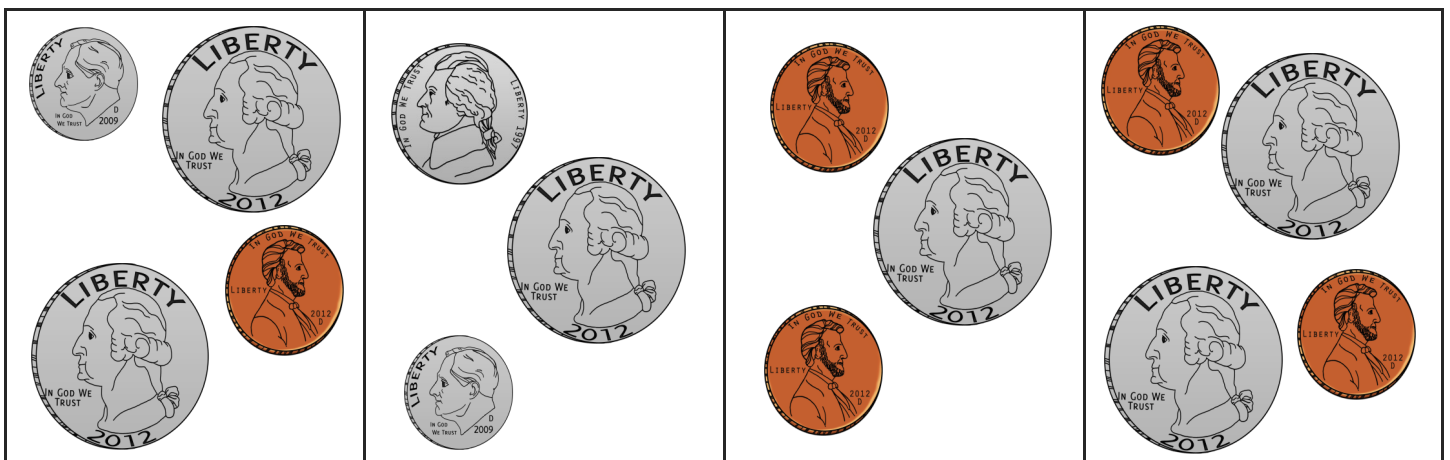
Riddle #1
