# Directions + Scoring

#### Things you'll need:

- 1. Pen for each player
- 2. Category card for each player
- 3. Blank cards provided or scrap paper for each player
- 4. Timer
- 5. Letter dice (optional)

#### Directions:

- 1. Cut out all category cards and give one to each player.
- 2. With a dice or at random, choose a letter for round 1.
- 3. Set the timer for 2-4 minutes. (we often use 3)
- 4. Each person/team must think of an item that fits in that category. To the left is an example; using the letter S.
- 5. You may not use the same thing for more than one category. (i.e. "Sherlock" as both a boy's name, and a TV show. However one person writing down "Sherlock" as a TV show and another writing it down as a boy's name is acceptable)
- 6. Articles (a, an, the) do not count. (i.e. for a TV show, The Voice could only be used under V, not T)
- 7. For names, both first and last names can be used. (For the category Celebrities with the letter S, both Taylor Swift or Samuel Jackson could be used.)

### Scoring:

- 1. Each unique answer counts as a point. If two or more people have the same answers for the same category, the answer is crossed out.
- 2. Answers like "Strawberry Swing" for song (letter S) or "Brady Bunch" for TV show (letter B) are worth two points.
- 3. The person with the most points at the end of all three rounds is the winner!
